VIETNAM

Hong Suong and her husband, Pastor Pham, and ministry teams have these plans for Christmas:

1. Street children: renting a soccer field and distributing 250 gift bags with chicken rice, snacks, milk, cookies, instant noodles and candy. Fun activities to teach the children about Jesus.

2. Hospitals: preparing and delivering 1,000 chicken rice meals along with extra bags of rice to patients in three hospitals.



They will prepare and deliver 1,000 meals to cancer hospital and other facilities.

3. Leprosy camps: Giving bags of soap, a can of milk, and a blanket.

4. Prisons: Preparing meals for over 150 inmates, along with activities to share the love of Christ with them.

The Emmanuel Orphanage program is focused on reaching out to those in need with love and compassion, spreading the message of hope through Christ. **Your gift will go far in sharing Jesus in Vietnam this Christmas.**

Home for Christmas

This has been an extremely difficult year for our friends in Democratic Republic of Congo, especially those at Congo for Christ Center (CCC.) Early in the year, rebels attacked Eastern DR Congo, killing thousands and bringing fear and turmoil to countless others. Reports cite 1.6 million displaced people this year alone. These numbers are staggering, but they speak of our friends and the children of CCC who had to be relocated to safe houses as the violence drew near to Uvira.

Pastor Daniel recently shared that they are nearing the time to bring the children back to CCC. He said every time they visit them, the children ask when they can return home to CCC. During their time in rental houses, they have lived more as a family with one Mama caring for the children. They have enjoyed this part of the time away from CCC and desire to continue as family units with their own Mama rather than one big dormitory cared for by all of the Mama's. Since we do not have the funds to build separate houses, Daniel has suggested they divide the existing dormitory rooms into separate bedrooms and let the children remain in the family units they have become accustomed to. The rooms also need renovation and painting before the children move back to CCC. The estimated cost for this work is \$4,552. Any donations to this project will be a tremendous help in bringing the children home and helping them feel settled and secure once again.
