

Violence Continues in DR Congo

While we hear news reports in America regarding the peace agreement reached between Rwanda, DR Congo and the M23 Rebels, the reality is life continues to be very difficult and dangerous for our friends at Congo for Christ (CCC). Daniel writes *"Since July, the security situation in Uvira has been unstable. Armed clashes between various factions have caused fear and displacement. The violence has displaced hundreds of thousands of people. Prices of goods have increased due to disrupted supply chains, and there are frequent power outages and transportation issues."*

Despite the very real danger our friends face every day, they continue to share the light of Christ in the darkness. Thankfully, the CCC children are healthy and have returned to school. Mango Tree School at CCC stands out as a beacon of hope offering small class sizes, dedicated teachers, and a nurturing environment. Six of the CCC students successfully completed their secondary education this summer and have been given assistance to help them as they transition out of CCC.

With the added expenses CCC is facing due to the conflict, resources are stretched thin. The needs in the community can be overwhelming, but CCC has

stepped up to help the children of three struggling families. While we are not assigning individual sponsors to the new children, we need your help in paying the expenses to provide all that is needed for these ten children.

The four children from the Wiljonda family are extremely thankful to join CCC. Georgette and Ibrahimu are now attending school at Mango Tree School. This is the first time in their lives to be in any school. The two youngest children, Celestin and Ana are receiving love and care at CCC. Their father, who was addicted to alcohol and drugs passed away in 2024. Due to his addictions, he did not provide for his family and after his death the children's mother had nothing to care for these four children. She began dating other men and after becoming pregnant, she totally neglected their care. Daniel said after joining CCC in September their hope has been renewed, and they now have the opportunity for a bright future full of God's wisdom and care.



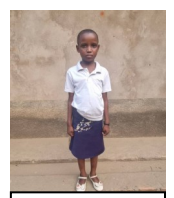

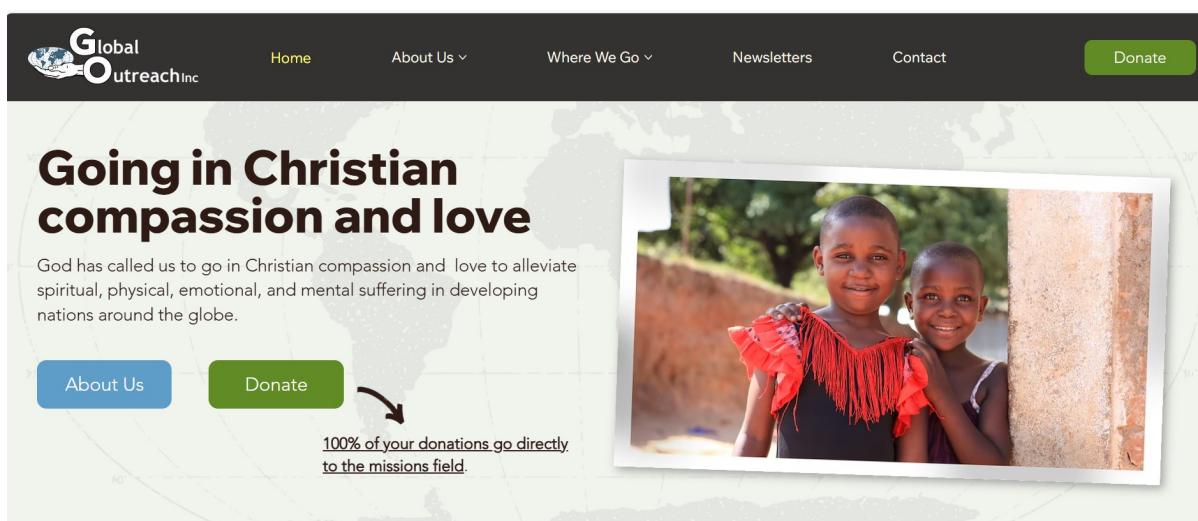


CCC expands their transportation income producing business to include this new water taxi.
