Rescued!

Pastor Richard in Myanmar received an urgent call from Benjamin, one of his team ministers who has been working several years to plant churches in tribal villages. Parents, aunties, and grandparents in two of the villages were so worried their children would be captured and forced to be child soldiers, they were having the children live and hide in the forest. These children, some as young as five years old, needed a new home and quickly. Reverend Richard assured him he would come and rescue them. Benjamin and one woman from each of the villages left with the children and hiked through the jungle. There they were able to meet Richard who had hired a truck to transport them safely to Agape Children's Home.

We received an urgent request for help as twenty-one new children would more than double the existing orphanage. We made funds available to him immediately along with a promise to help with the ongoing needs. After looking into the situation further, we were surprised to learn that Myanmar is the nation with the highest number of child soldiers. Children twelve and over are given guns for fighting, while the younger children are used as servants to clean, carry supplies, and other forced labor.

er been to school, had not learned to speak or read or write Burmese, and many were malnourished. Fortunately, one of the children already at Agape spoke the

Clothing for Children in Congo

Since the community feeding program started in 2016 Pastor Jeremiah and Daniel have been concerned about the great need to provide not only food, but also clothing for the children. Thanks to a generous gift from Sterling Church of Christ in Bellingham, Washington, that good work has finally begun. We were able to send enough money for Congo for Christ (CCC) to purchase 1,750 pieces of used clothing to distribute at a recent weekly feeding program. They were able to give every child a piece of clothing and when they were finished had distributed clothing to 1,690 children.

While we rejoice over this blessing for the children, it has caused another problem. Since the clothing giveaway the attendance at the weekly feeding program has greatly increased. Sadly, last week they were unable to feed all of the 2,150 children who attended. Daniel said that even though they decreased the amount given to each child, they had to send 104 children home without food. They said the children were crying and the staff was crying. I have to admit to a few tears as well, when I read this news. Currently we send \$1,800 monthly for the feeding program, but it is obvious we need to increase this budget again. Thank you for every gift you give to this life sustaining program!
