

"You Must Leave!"

Pastor Richard recently shared pictures and a compelling story highlighting the challenges faced by new believers in Pan Hong Village, located in Shan State, Myanmar. After Missionary Khin presented the message of the Gospel to members of the LaHu and Palaung tribes, more than 50 individuals responded by giving their hearts to Jesus and were subsequently baptized in water.



Six families homes were destroyed and they were forced to leave the village after believing in Jesus as Savior.

However, this newfound faith came at a significant cost. On February 5, 2026, six families in Pan Hong Village were expelled from their homes and the village itself. The village chief notified them that their profession of faith in Christ meant they could no longer remain in the community. Their homes were destroyed, their possessions were taken, and they were forcibly driven out of the village. One of the newly converted family members was quoted as saying, **"They can destroy our houses, but no one can destroy what we have in Jesus."**



Pastor Richard explained "As they don't have anywhere to stay, they just stay under a tree."

Pastor Richard called upon others to join in prayer for these new Christians, that they might find a new place to call home. There was reason to give thanks: after two weeks of uncertainty, these families were welcomed by the home village of Missionary Khin. The chief of Khin's village generously provided them with

land where water was accessible. Furthermore, the village's church community rallied, assisting the displaced families by gathering bamboo and helping them build new homes. As they are able, the villagers are providing food for these families as well. Even with this support, they still need \$1,000 per family to buy metal roofing for their new bamboo houses. To date, we have sent \$1,000 to purchase tin for one roof. Every gift for Myanmar displaced families will be a tremendous blessing and will confirm in their hearts what the Apostle Paul said in 1 Corinthians 12:26, **“If one part suffers, every part suffers with them; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with them.”**

Update from Congo for Christ Center

As the unrest caused by the ongoing conflict in DR Congo continues, we do have some encouraging news to share. As the city of Uvira reported damage, looting, killings and injuries, we are thankful to report that Congo for Christ Center and the children and staff all remain safe. The children are ready to return to CCC, and we pray that will happen in April or May. After living for a year in separate rented homes, it has been decided to partition the existing dormitory rooms into four homes with

fifteen children and one Mama per home. That work has already been done, and the rooms are ready for the children. The remaining item that is needed is to build three small kitchens so the food can be cooked and served in a family atmosphere in each home. The main food supplies will be purchased in bulk and shared, but each Mama will be able to cook and meet the needs of her assigned family. The cost of this project is \$3700, and all gifts will be very helpful.
