We wish to inform our Global Outreach family of the passing of Pastor Wanchai Supawas. Pastor Wanchai's youth was marked by a search for truth that initially led him to the Buddhist priesthood. However, at the age of thirty, his life took a turn after he encountered powerful testimonies of healing and transformation through faith in Christ. Deeply moved by these experiences, Pastor Wanchai prayed and accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Lord and Savior.

After his conversion, Pastor Wanchai experienced a dramatic change in his own life. He was empowered to leave behind former habits and a lifestyle he recognized as sinful. This spiritual rebirth had a ripple effect, touching the lives of those closest to him and leading them to faith in Christ as well. Pastor Wanchai's walk with God was distinguished by instances of miraculous protection and divine guidance.

Answering God's call, Pastor Wanchai pursued formal studies at the Bible Study Center. He soon began his ministry at Sameong Church in Chiang Mai Province, Thailand. There, he also established a home dedicated to helping wayward girls. Through this compassionate outreach, funded in great part by Global Outreach, numerous young women were rescued from the grip of drugs and destructive lifestyles, finding new hope and purpose through Jesus Christ.
