We provided the funds last year to purchase the land but have been waiting funding to begin construction. Another \$11,000 is needed to complete the new building, as well as \$3,000 for school supplies for over 250 orphans in the fourteen children's homes.

## Water Need Still Critical at Congo for Christ

Last month we shared how the recent flooding in Uvira, DR Congo has severely damaged the main water system which has provided water to Congo for Christ and the surrounding community for the past twelve years. A large portion of the pipeline is missing and there is major damage to the station where the pipeline begins. As you can see in the picture, the children are now having to carry water from the river for use at Congo for Christ. The water does not look clean and there is a very real threat of cholera and other waterborne diseases. The immediate repairs needed to get the water flowing again will cost \$7,000. We are still in need of \$4,700 to meet this need. We extend a big thank you to all who have donated towards the repairs urgently needed. Every gift is a tremendous help for this critical need!
