Sickness at Congo for Christ

Over the past few weeks more than half of the children at Congo for Christ have been sick with various illnesses such as malaria and typhoid. At first the children were being transported to the local hospital as needed. When the numbers continued to increase, Dr. Jacques, agreed to visit Congo for Christ Centre (CCC) twice a day and treat the children there. We are thankful to report that the children are improving

and the doctor is no longer making the visits to CCC. He offered a few recommendations to help prevent similar outbreaks in the future. Mosquito nets and jackets have already been provided. Dr. Jacques recommended each child have two jackets so they can have one to wear while the other is being washed, or wet from rain. The cost to provide another used jacket is \$6. In addition, the children each need a set of sheets at a cost of \$12, and a blanket at \$15, which will total \$2,145 for all children. To buy these items for one child will cost \$33.

We are happy to report that the cooking area was rebuilt in June. It had become unsafe due to constant In addition to use. feeding the CCC children daily. about 1,500 extra meals are prepared weekly for the community children who attend the feeding program. The older CCC children continue to bake bread so that all the children now have a delicious piece of bread and a cup of hot tea for breakfast.

It takes a lot to care for sixty children and make sure they have the necessities. Many of you sponsor one or more of these children, which is a big help but rarely covers all the costs. If any sponsors are able to increase your monthly giving from \$47 to \$50 or \$55 it would be a blessing. All gifts for CCC are always appreciated for the extras that are always needed.

Work on the two orphanages has been stopped until the lockdown situation is changed. They continue to hope this will end soon and the construction can continue. At the present time \$14,850 is still needed for the completion of the Regulagunta Children's Home.
