Congo for Christ Center (CCC) is celebrating ten years since the children's home opened in 2012. Tremendous progress has been made in a decade, and the "family" continues to expand. In April and May of 2020, severe flooding hit Uvira and many people lost their lives. As a result, many of the newly orphaned children have found a loving home at CCC. Since 2012, ninety-six children have been residents at CCC. Of those, eleven have completed their training or will soon be finishing either vocational school or university. As they transition into their adult lives and leave CCC, we will notify each child's sponsor and give them the opportunity to sponsor one of the new children.

We are currently seeking new sponsors for nineteen children. Since the beginning of the sponsorship program, the monthly cost has been \$47. As expenses have risen substantially over the past ten years, we are asking new sponsors to give \$55 per month. A small price to change a life!

Pastor Jeremiah is expecting to travel to Kenya for heart surgery this month. He needs \$27,000 for the surgery and of that amount \$15,200 has been received. Thanks to all who have given! Your prayers and gifts are greatly appreciated.

Two New Children's Homes in India



About a year ago we shared the need to replace two new homes for children in India. Severe flooding had damaged the existing homes and the government required they be torn down. Even though construction was delayed due to Covid outbreaks, we are thankful to report both new homes are now open. Pictured above are the fifteen children at Pothavaram receiving their new supplies. In addition to being a children's home, each of the new buildings were constructed with a large verandah as pictured above. They use the verandah for church services and also as a place for elderly church members to sleep at night. Many widows do not have a place to stay and need the protection provided in this way.

A pastor and wife raise ten to fifteen children in a loving, Christian environment. Many of the other homes are aging and in need of repairs or being rebuilt.
